The Oxford Group

A semi religious but informal movement founded by Frank N.D. Buchman while an undergraduate at Oxford University in 1921. The name was first applied by the press of South Africa in 1928.

The professed purpose of the movement is "to solve personal, national and international problems by bringing men and women everywhere back to basic principles of Christian Faith enhancing all of their primary loyalties."

Without the benefit of organization, memberships, subscriptions or definite creed, the movement rapidly gained adherents in nearly all countries of the world, particularly in the middle and upper classes, and was accorded recognition by the heads of many governments. Adopting the slogan of "moral rearmament" in 1938, the leaders of the movement sought by spread of it's principles to stem the rising tide of international hostilities.



What is the Oxford Group?

You cannot belong to the Oxford Group. It has no membership list, subscriptions, badge, rules or definite location. It is a name for a group of people who, from every rank, profession and trade, in many countries, have surrendered their lives to God and who are endeavoring to lead a spiritual quality of life under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.



The Oxford Group is not a religion; it has no hierarchy, no temples, no endowments; its workers have no salaries, no plans but Gods plan; every country is their country, every man their brother.

Oxford Group had a power I did not have. They said however, that I could have it – just as they did—if I would pay the same price, comply with the same conditions and go through the same series of exceedingly simple steps.



Oxford Group Steps

1 The Sharing of our sins and temptations with another Christian life given to God, and to use Sharing as Witness to help others, still unchanged, to recognize and acknowledge their sins.

2 Surrender of our life, past, present, and future, into God's keeping and direction.

Oxford Group Steps

3. Restitution to all whom we have wronged directly or indirectly.

4. Listening to, accepting, relying on God's Guidance and carrying it out in everything we do or say, great or small.

Third Step

▲ What is the Oxford Group, 1933

It is a simple decision, put into simple language, spoken aloud to God, in front of a witness, at any time and in any place, that we have decided to forget the past in God and to give our future into his keeping. Nothing more need be added; nothing can be taken away.

I have made a mess of it, trying to run it myself. You take it – the whole thing – and run it for me, according to your will and plan.



- ▲ Equally vilified by hawks and doves; labor and management; liberals and conservatives; fascists and communists worldwide.






CALVARY CHURCH AND HOUSE FROM FOURTH AVENUE.

Oxford Group Hits Stride In Akron Modern Revival

Buchman and Followers Begin Personal Meetings Today in New-Style Evangelism; Score Will Fill Pulpits Sunday;

Hundreds Throng First Session to Hear Converts

The Oxford group of dinner jacket revivalists started about the serious business of winning Akron to Christ today after a whirlwind opening meeting last night that drew close to 3500 people to iam two improvised meeting houses.

"Personal evangelism"-one man talking to another or a woman discussing problems with another woman was the order of the day. The clergy of the city got together with Dr. Frank N. D. Buchman, founder of the group, to talk over things that bothered them, and about 400 women gathered in Hotel May







Ebby Thacher makes a decision for Christ at Calvary Mission and his drink obsession is removed.

Ebby receives "guidance" to visit Bill Wilson.

Sam Shoemaker and Harry Hadley found the Calvary Mission.

Thank God for Hitler

▲ Our aim is total and permanent sobriety



An Alcoholics Anonymous is

An alcoholic who through application of and adherence to the rules laid down by the organization, has completely forsworn the use of any and all alcoholic beverages



A.A. Membership

- ▲ The moment he wittingly takes even a drop of beer, wine He automatically loses all status as a member of Alcoholics Anonymous
- AA is not interested in sobering up drunks who are not sincere in their desire to remain completely sober for all time.

To the Newcomer

▲ If you are not ready to part with alcohol forever, it would be better for all concerned if you discontinue reading this and give up the idea of becoming a member of Alcoholics Anonymous



To the Sponsor

▲ You have in your hands the most valuable property in the world — the future of a fellow man. Treat his life as carefully as you would treat your own. You are literally responsible for his life.



Success Rate

Alcoholics Anonymous is one hundred percent effective for those who follow the rules. It is those who try to cut corners who find themselves in their old drunken state.



The Results

▲ There is no satisfaction in the world like watching the progress of a new Alcoholics Anonymous.....No whiskey in the world can give you this thrill.



Pink Cloud 1940's Style

▲ You will be tireless in your efforts to help others. It is a splendid enthusiasm! Cherish it for as long as you can.



The Jumping Off Point

▲ For you are ready to sponsor some other poor alcoholic who is desperately in need of help, both human and Divine.

So God bless and keep you both!



Cultivate Humility

▲ You aren't very important in this world. If you lose your job someone better will replace you. If you die your wife will mourn you briefly, and then remarry..... in the last analysis, you are the only one who benefits by your sobriety. Seek to cultivate humility. Remember that cockiness leads to a speedy fall.



Medical Opinion

▲ Medical men will tell you that all alcoholics are alike at least in one respect: they are emotionally immature.

In other words alcoholics have not learned to think like adults



Don't Criticize

▲ The methods of others, strangely enough, you may change your own ideas as you grow older in sobriety. Remember there are dozens of roads from New York to Chicago but they all land in Chicago.



When will I be cured?

▲ That depends entirely upon how quickly you can succeed in changing you entire outlook upon life. It may take weeks or it may take months. Your sincerity and capacity for working with others in the AA program will determine the length of time.



Alcoholics Anonymous is

- A Based on a set of laws known as the Twelve Steps.....those who live up to these rules stay sober.
- ▲ Those who gloss over or ignore any one rule are in constant danger of returning to a life of drunkenness.
- ▲ Thousands of words could be written on each rule



What a Sponsor Does

▲ Lack of space prevents..... So it is suggested that they be explained by the sponsor. If he cannot explain them he should provide someone who could.

Gresham's Law in Alcoholic's Anonymous

▲ That bad currency tends to drive out good- has been operative in Alcoholics Anonymous. Weak AA is tending to drive out the strong.



Three Ways of Working Steps

- ▲ Strong, original way, proved powerfully and reliably effective for over 70 years
- ▲ Medium way, not so strong, not so safe, not so sure, not so good, still effective.
- ▲ Weak way, no way at all but literally a false teaching. A corruption of the stated program.



Strong AA

- ▲ Does all 12 Steps and keeps on taking them
- Practices rigorous honesty
- ▲ Takes and continues to make restitution
- ▲ Admits faults
- Prays and meditates daily
- ▲ Goes to two or more AA meetings weekly
- ▲ Actively works the 12th Step



Medium AA

- Starts off with a bang, stays sober
- ♣ Procrastinates on parts they don't like God steps or inventory steps
- ▲ One meeting a week
- ▲ Less and less self examination
- ▲ No effective sponsorship
- ▲ Service at a group level



Weak AA

- ▲ Unlike medium, big chunks left out of program
- Attends lots of meetings
- ▲ Stays away from the first drink
